### Minutes:

#### **Review of Last Month**

**Tommy talking about High School jumpstart class.** We are taking our Tier 3 (most at risk students) and putting them in FOCUS for 2 class periods a day. One of those class periods is working on Social-Emotional Learning and the other is a study hall. So, far the passing rate for these students overall has increased by 5%. For most of the students most of their attendance, behavior, and grades have improved. We are trying to roll this out 4th quarter to 7th graders. The whole point is early intervention and decreasing high school dropouts.

Funding that PBIS could use could be a school store, PBIS quarterly fun activities, building up the jumpstart program, a wellness room to furnish and staff.

**Numbers:** Our numbers should be 980 for next year which is what we have this year. We are going to reclaim the computer lab in the library for a classroom. Our outlook right now is right around 1,000 students, depending on growth though we might be looking at a need for more portables.

**Safety:** No change at pedestrian crosswalks or safe walking routes. If we were to put anything on the other side of 200N that would require city approval that says “Not a Drop-Off Zone”. The city doesn’t plow all the way to the sidewalks so ask them to do that. In April the Safety Committee will have a decision regarding the Parent Drop Off/Pick Up Zone. Invite city member to come to the next Community Council Meeting to talk about signage for drop off zone, ect. Safety Committee is investigating a possible second door at the front of the school for increased safety.
