Public Comment:

- Looking to order for next year by July.
- Marie suggested receiving donations from families with extra books for a book pantry.
- Michelle suggested a quick read category to help them select books as well as some kind of sticker to personalize it as many will have the same book?

Book Trolley

 Books selected that were popular and added to the Panther Payoff cart. About 15 sold of 30. Reaching another demographic through books on the cart that does not purchase current incentives. Not sustainable with PBIS budget but happy to offer if provided by Community Council funding per Tommy Hirschi.

School.Utah.Gov Data

- ELA 44% proficiency (District 46% State 43%)
- Math 35% proficiency (District 41% State 42%) all students in the double classes Math 7&8 passed
- 18% of EL students made adequate progress
- Science 44% proficiency (District 47% State 47%)
- Teachers attribute this to transitions from online, part time, and full time learning
- Gina asked about previous year scores for math pre COVID
- Science department utilizes a flipped classroom where instruction is given but individualized instruction is given online. It is more difficult to do math in that format.
- How can this data help us drive the budget aides, software, manipulatives, drill and practice – how to reinforce instruction in a fun way
- Using ESSER funds for part time teacher to budget for pull outs / interventions
- CALPS Cognitive Academic Language Processing Skills vs BICS Basic Interpersonal Communication Skills discussed
